Meditation

Meditate on John 15:5



Object Lesson: A Dry Sponge in Water

What you need:

- 1. Bowl of water
- 2. Cup
- 3. Sponge

If you put a sponge in water, you expect it to come out wet, right? When we go through troubles, we oftentimes come out affected. However, when we remain in Jesus, we're able to go through difficulties and come out untouched. We're demonstrating this with a sponge (us), in a cup (Jesus), placed in water (the trials of this world).

Instructions:

- 1. Place paper towel or sponge in the bottom of your cup so that it stays there while turning the cup upside down. If you don't have a sponge, a paper towel will do.
- 2. Hold the cup upside down with the paper towel/sponge in the bottom of the cup and submerge it into the bowl of water.
- 3. Hold it there as long as you wish, then pull it out and see if your paper towel/sponge is dry.
