## Think about It

Peace is one of the most misunderstood words. Many people think that peace is when everyone is getting along. Of course, when two armies stop fighting, we say they have made peace. But when the Bible talks about peace, it is talking about something far better than the absence of fighting. It is talking about something so incredible - we can experience it even in the middle of a storm or bad times. The peace God offers is far better than just problems going away, it is a quiet trust that He is on control and up to something good even when everything around us might look crazy! That's why when Jesus offered peace He said, "In this world you will have troubles, but take heart! I have overcome the world!" (John 16:33)



Name of the Game: Finger Wars! Needed: Just your fingers!

What you do: Take turns pairing off. To battle, both players say "Ready, set...battle!" and show one to five fingers at the same time. The player who shows one more finger than the opponent wins (and one finger beats five!). If players show the same number or are two or more apart, the battle is a draw. Battle and eliminate opponents until someone wins. Smaller families can play for first to get ten victories! Keep track of your score and make sure everyone plays the same number of people to keep it even. While usually the bigger number wins, in this game a pinky finger can win! In the end, everyone make peace with each other!
